Dear Mr. PEET:

The 2026-27 State Budget provides funding to support the repair, rehabilitation, and modernization of local roads and bridges. The Budget includes \$698.1 million in Consolidated Local Street and Highway Improvement Program (CHIPS) funding, \$150 million in PAVE-NY funding, and \$100 million in Extreme Winter Recovery (EWR) funding, \$140 million in State Touring Route (STR) funding and \$100 million in Pavé Our Potholes (POP). Also included are reappropriations of rollover funds remaining from previous State fiscal year CHIPS, PAVE-NY, EWR, STR and POP appropriations. Please provide a copy of this letter to the chief financial officer for your municipality.

The next quarterly SFY 2026-27 CHIPS, PAVE-NY, EWR and POP reimbursements are scheduled to be made on July 17, 2026. Requests for the July payments must be for expenditures made on or after January 17, 2025 through June 12, 2026. Refer to the Program Guidelines on the CHIPS website (www.dot.ny.gov/programs/chips) regarding eligible project activities and program requirements. The Town of Hume has the following funding amounts available for the July payments.

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) Regional Office must receive all program payment submission items no later than **June 12, 2026**. Please sign the certification on each page of the reimbursement request forms and keep a copy of the completed forms for your files. Your NYSDOT municipal code for entry on the forms is 610408.

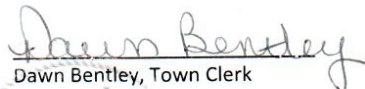
